

## Kansas Kiwanis Foundation Giving Levels

The donor's balance is an accumulated balance, it does not start over at each level.

### Life Membership

A \$100 donation you receive a Life Membership Plaque engraved with your number and name.

### James W. Putnam

A \$500 donation you will receive a Life Membership Plaque and a Putnam Award Medallion engraved with your number and name.

### Living Recognition

A \$1000 donation is a Living Recognition, you would receive a Life Membership Plaque, Putnam Award Medallion and be able to designate a 501 C 3 organization to receive the proceeds from their account (dividends). The Foundation is currently paying 3% ie that would be \$30 on a \$1000 balance sent yearly to the designated organization, when the donor passes away it becomes a Service Memorial and is sent yearly in memory of the donor. This continues as long as the 501 C 3 organization exists. The donor also has the option to change the designation at any time.

## Eliminate Project

Through The Eliminate Project, Kiwanis International and UNICEF have joined forces to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus—a deadly disease that steals the lives of 34,000 innocent babies and a significant number of women each year in 18 countries. They're waiting for us to fulfill our pledges—so we can turn promises into funding; funding into vaccines; and vaccines into lives saved and futures protected. The end of this disease means the beginning of better health for so many of these families.



## Service Projects

### Easter Egg Hunt

Held prior to Easter. Easter eggs are stuffed with candy. Eggs are sorted by age group and scattered throughout NWTech Campus Lawn and Soccer Field. Area children attend and scramble to find their eggs.

### Trunk or Treat

The annual event brings Halloween to a blocked off portion of Main Street where families go from car trunk to car trunk to get candy. Kiwanis participates by handing out candy in the Halloween themed trunk.

### Meals on Wheels (MOW)

The Kiwanis Club of Goodland volunteers to deliver MOW twice a year. This service makes a huge impact to those in need by delivering nutritious food and friendly visits in our community.

### Scholarships

Each year scholarships to local students to attend college are awarded. Scholarships are given to both freshman and sophomores that are attending college. Kiwanis members children receive preferred consideration.

### Service Leadership Programs (SLP)

Our club sponsors one student led club. Kiwanis members are encouraged to attend their club meetings and participate in their club projects/activities. Meeting location and time are announced at the Kiwanis Meetings.

### Toys for Tots

The Goodland Kiwanis Club partners and participates with Genesis for our local toy collection campaign and toy distribution which takes place in December.

## Funding

## Club Fundraisers

### Flag Project

The Goodland Flag Project began in 2007 and today places over 890 flags in front of homes and businesses on six holidays: Flag Day, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, 9/11 and Veteran's Day. The cost per flag is \$35.00 a year. Kiwanis members place the flags at sunrise and pick up the flags at sunset.

### Kiwanis Food Shack

The Kiwanis shack is known for its world famous Kiwanis Burger. It is open at the Annual 4th of July Freedom Festival Event as well as the week of the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair, held annually the first full week in August.

### Kiwanis Demolition Derby

Goodland Kiwanis is the coordinator for the Demolition Derby held yearly at the NWKDFF.

Kids, we fund children and their activities! Student Scholarships, Toys for Tots, Genesis, student activities and projects, local events, community projects, Boy Scouts, Goodland Activities Center, Goodland Public Library, playground equipment for USD 352 and much more!

Meetings start at approximately 12:15. The President calls the meeting to order by ringing the Kiwanis bell. Members stand. The pledge of allegiance is recited and then the invocation. Members sit. The President asks if there are any guests. If so, introductions are made. Member birthdays and anniversaries are shared, reports are made on club activities and then announcements from the members are accepted. Once club business is conducted, the speaker is introduced. Members stand when the speaker is introduced. To adjourn the meeting, the President will ring the Kiwanis bell. Meetings end at approximately 1 p.m.

## K-Lotto

The K-Lotto box is passed around the room at the beginning of the meeting. Members can buy a ticket for \$1.00. At the end of the meeting, a ticket is drawn. The winning ticket may get an item donated by a member or speaker. If none, half of the weekly donations are retained by the club, and the remainder is awarded to the holder of the winning ticket.
